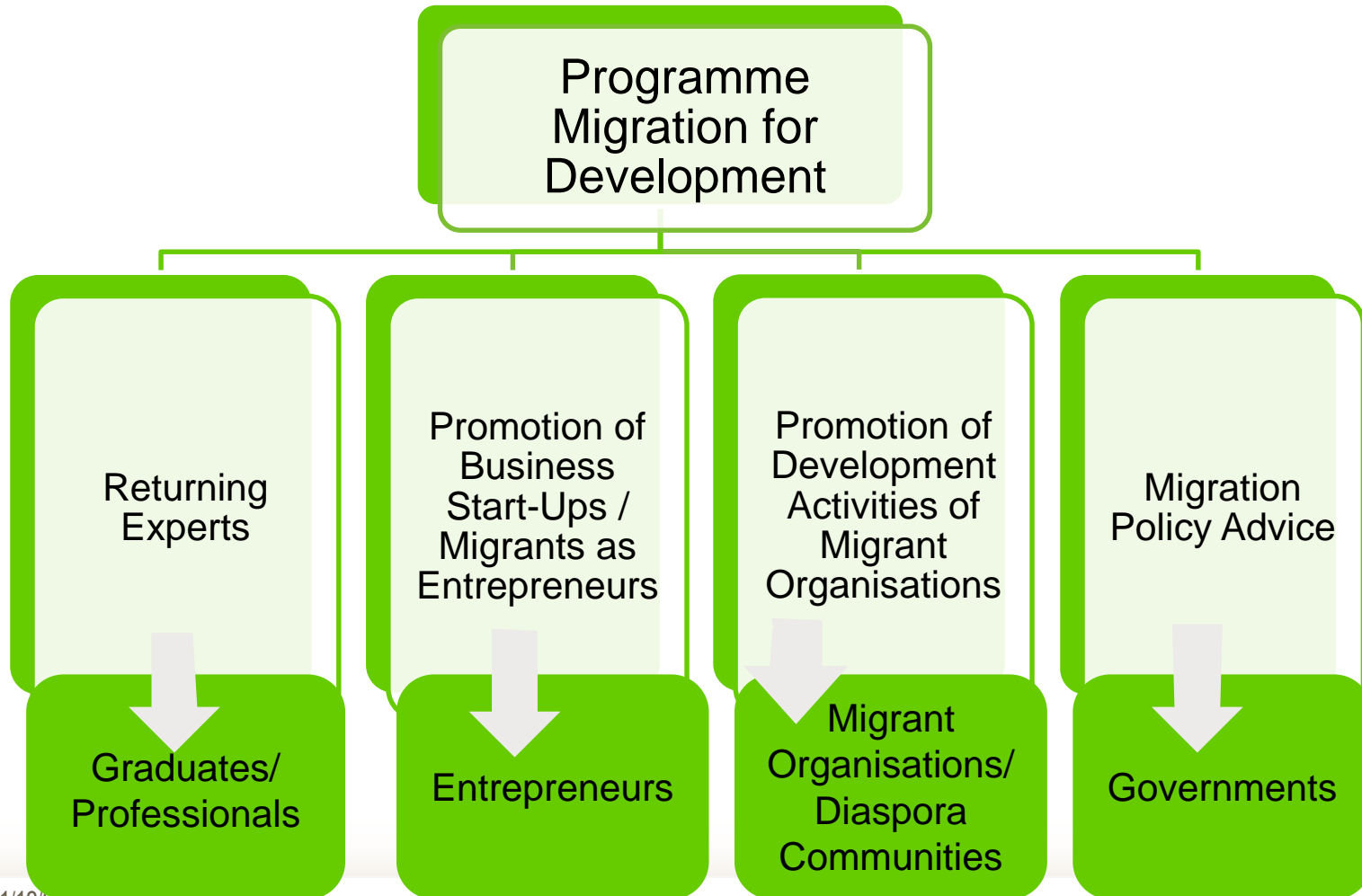


## What we do

## Migration for Development Programme –Global Portfolio





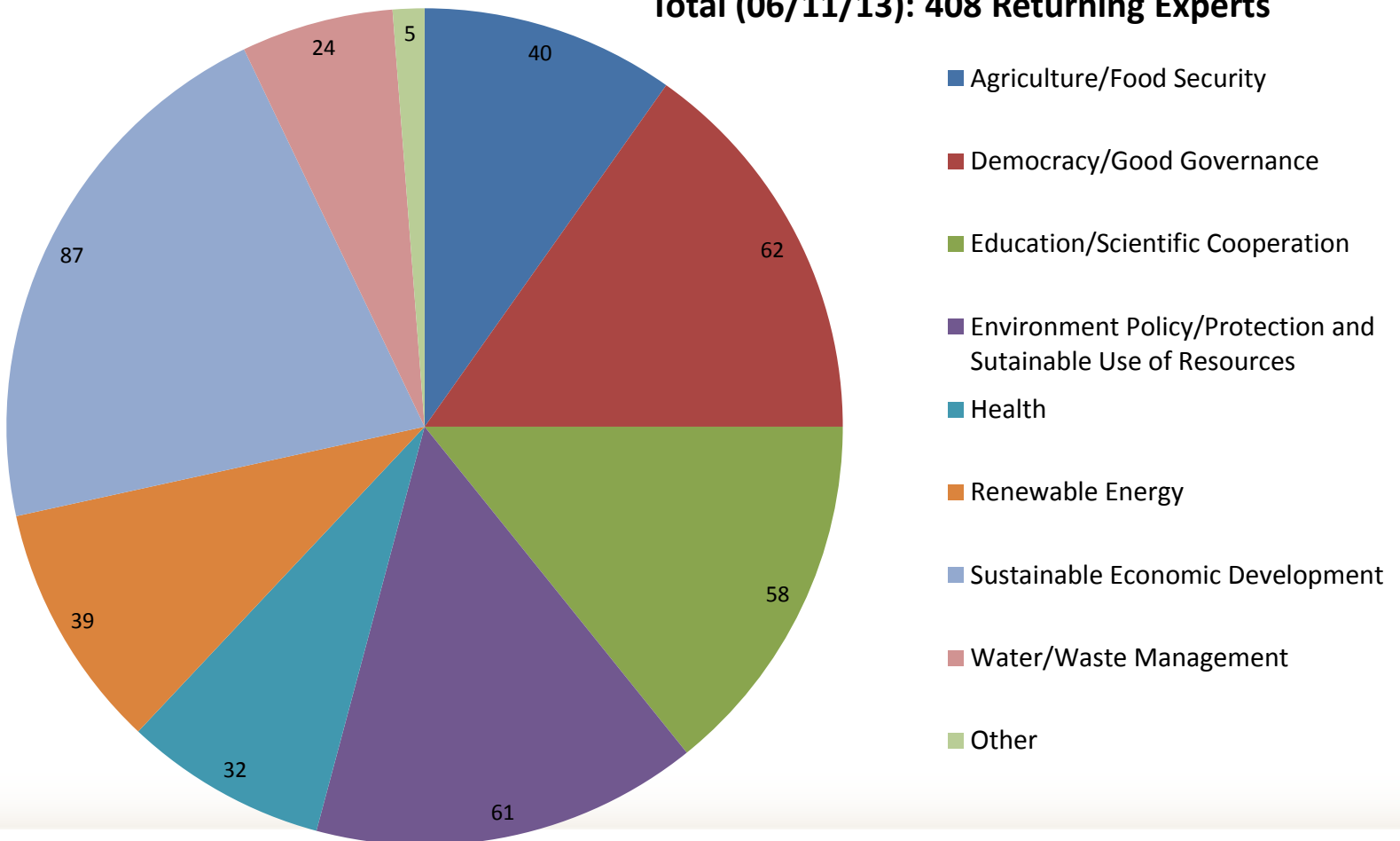

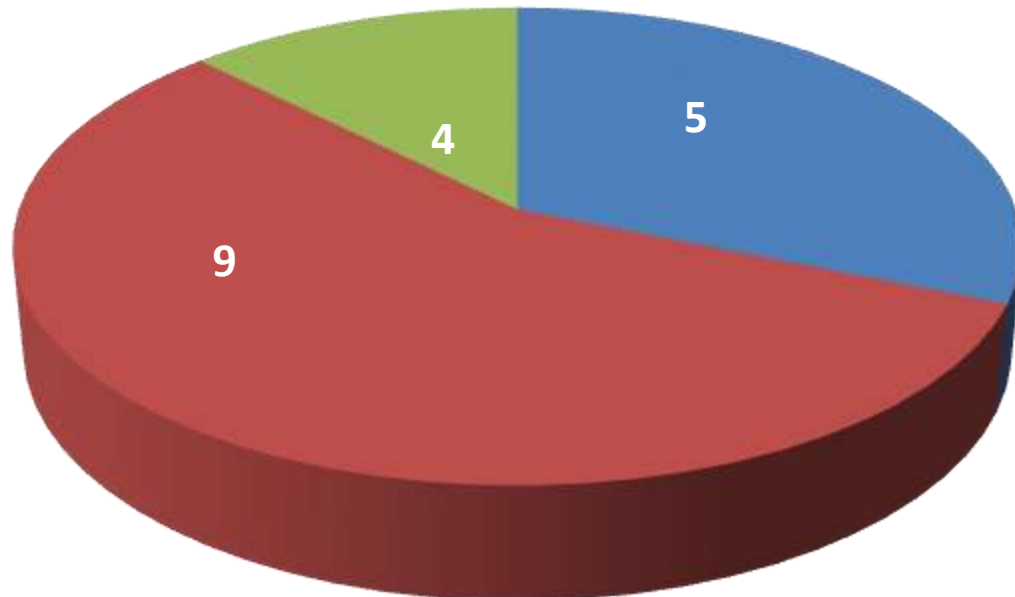
